Getting from research to practice: A case study in scaling from research trial to national replication

**1 research program; 3 randomized controlled trials;
100,000 families served across the U.S.**

Come hear Peggy Hill, Director of Program Development at The Nurse-Family Partnership National Service Office in Denver Colorado, speak about national replication of research-based health programs.

The Nurse-Family Partnership is an evidence-based community health program based on research conducted by Dr. David Olds and colleagues at the University of Colorado Prevention Research Center. **Although the context for Ms. Hill's presentation is the Nurse-Family Partnership program, her remarks are aimed at the challenges of bringing any research-based health improvement program to scale.**

Peggy Hill has played an instrumental role in the replication of the Nurse-family Partnership program since its early days. She works with funders, state governments and health agencies to help communities implement and sustain the program, assuring that new program sites have the resources needed to achieve outcomes comparable to those achieved in the randomized trials. Ms. Hill has over 20 years of experience establishing and replicating community-based programs to improve family and child health.
